Discussion: ITHS grant: Develop a transitional workforce in the region - regional program Would increase opportunities in the region Fund the TL1 program (NIHS training grant) It there a way to help students with tuition for some students – have not had discussions about finances yet. – do a lot of education, boot camps, online modules, research, region-wide – online modules – interactive ZOOM based mentoring groups. Research pathway: elective opportunities for students. - Fate of the III – slot into III in the summer for research pathway student

2. E-18 III Exit Survey Review			
Discussion: Collecting Data as each cohort completes the III (E17 and E18), <i>data survey attached</i> . Reviewed Background Survey for Scholarship of Discovery and Integration student survey key points reviewed. Reviewed student surveys for Scholarship of Discovery and Integration students only: Reviewed data for: - Finding a faculty mentor E17's and E18's - Opportunities at or near their foundations site - Access to participate in research at or near Seattle			

- NEW Question for E18's: Access to scholarly opportunities to complete the III Scholarship – this will be asked of all students starting in E19.

Take homes:

Among E18's

- **8.3%** (14/167) students in RUOP completed a research project outside the III.
- **28.6%** (2/7) students in GHIP completed a research project outside the III.

Among E18 SoD students

- **85%** agree or strongly agree that **the III was a valuable experience**
- Students spent an average of **36 hours per week** on the III (stdev 14, max 70, min 6)
- Students studied for **Step 1** an average of **14.6 hours per week**
- Those who did SoD at another Foundation Site spent on average **\$1548** (\$1393) above the moving fund.

Discussion:

What regional deans have access to clinical research that is not associated with UW, could increase regional offerings – students need a co-mentor if they use someone that is not at a UW facility.

Updated processes is helping to clarify research at/near Seattle

Data directory – optics are bad, many opportunities in the region not in the data base of opportunities.

- Some projects can be completed remotely
- Categorize by the student rather than the region – as a possibility to help optics?

General questions among E18's:

- Some students trying to do SoD work in Spring to free up their summer.
- Some RUOP and GHIP students did research outside of III.
- Students spending about 50 hours doing research and also III, what was expected.

New question possibility:

- Reasons for **why** very poor if they put it as very poor

Research Opportunities (SoD or SoI) by location for each class:

- Growth over the years: Directory, local and totals.
- Data may not be totally complete – may not have all local opportunities.
- Local research advisers did a great job collecting regional local offerings.
- Students are going to all sites for SoD and SoI – not all 100 students in Seattle are in Seattle. There are regional students are in Seattle AND regional students going to other regional campuses.

Foundations offset costs, increase from E17 to E18, not expected to increase again.
